2020 Cayuse Classic Horse Show Saturday, June 27 at Sidney Peak Ranch Rules for Western, English, Hunter and Jumper Horse Show

GENERAL RULES: **SORRY - NO SPECTATORS**

1. No dogs allowed.
2. All riders are required to sign a liability waiver before they ride.
3. All horses must pass a health inspection before they enter any arena. An on-site veterinarian will provide this inspection at no cost to the participants.
4. **All competitors must register online before 10:00 am Friday, June 26th.**
5. Competitor number will follow horse and rider combination.
6. A junior rider is one who is 17 years of age or younger as of January 1, 2020.
7. Three announcements will be made for each class. The entry gate will be closed following the third announcement and late riders will not be allowed into the arena. Registration fees will not be refunded.
8. Riding helmets with chinstraps must be worn when schooling and showing over jumps. Protective headgear is always recommended whenever riding.
9. Boots with adequate heel required.
10. No martingales or tie downs will be allowed in any flat classes.
11. No tendon boots, polo-wraps, bell boots or other protective leg wear will be allowed.
12. In all jumping classes, rider with three refusals will be eliminated from that class.
13. Standard 4-H rules will apply, except that any USEF approved bit is allowed for any age horse.
14. In case of bad weather, the organizers reserve the right to alter and/or cancel classes.
15. The organizers and property owners will not be responsible for loss or damage to persons or property.

WALK/TROT DIVISION:

Open to all riders of any discipline. May be split between adults and juniors at show management discretion.

Ribbons will be awarded for each class and the division. Riders entering these classes may not be judged in any other class. They may enter in other classes as an audit/ride for experience only.

Pleasure (class 13): To be judged on the obedience and manageability of the horse.

Equitation (class 14): To be judged on the rider's position and ability to ride correctly.

WESTERN DIVISION: Participants will be divided as adults and juniors, ribbons will be awarded for each class and each division.

*Pleasure (classes 1, 4) Walk, jog and lope both directions of the arena; to be judged on the obedience and manageability of the horse.

*Equitation (classes 2, 5) Walk, jog and lope both directions of the arena; to be judged on the rider's position and ability to ride correctly.

*Horsemanship (classes 3, 6) Walk, jog and lope following a posted pattern; participants will compete individually and be judged on the rider's ability to follow the pattern and handle the horse.

English Division: Participants will be divided as adults and juniors, ribbons will be awarded for each class and each division.

*Pleasure (classes 7, 10) Walk, trot and canter both directions of the arena; to be judged on the obedience and manageability of the horse.

*Equitation (classes 8, 11) Walk, trot and canter both directions of the arena; to be judged on the rider's position and ability to ride correctly.

*Hunter Hack (classes 9, 12) Walk, trot and canter; after rail work is completed, each rider will jump two cross rails individually. To be judged on an even pace, the horses mannerism and jumping style.

HUNTER DIVISION:

An open division where adults and juniors are judged together. To be judged on the performance, form and movement of the horse both on the flat (walk, trot and canter both directions) and over a set course of jumps. A different course will be set for each jumping class round 1 and round 2. Ribbons will be awarded for each class and each division. If a horse and rider combination is judged in the cross rail over fences classes, they may not be judged in the 2'6" over fences classes, but may enter it as an audit for experience.

* Cross Rail Hunter division includes 1 under saddle class and 2 over fences classes. (Classes 15, 16, 17)

* 2' Hunter division includes 1 under saddle class and 2 over fences classes. (Classes 18, 19, 20)

*2'6" Hunter division includes 1 under saddle class and 2 over fences classes. (Classes 21, 22, 23)

JUMPER DIVISION: 2'6"-2'9"

An open division where adults and juniors and judged together. Ribbons will be awarded for each class and the division.

*Power and Speed: (class 24) complete the set first part of the course without faults and continue, without stopping, through the second set part. To be judged on jumping faults and speed/time.

*Table 2 section 2b: (class 25) complete a set course of jumps: if completed without faults, wait for judge's whistle then complete a different set jump off course against the clock. To be judged on jumping faults and time.

DETAILS:

Location:

June 27, Sidney Peak Ranch, 32090 Routt County Road 14, Steamboat Springs

Time Schedule: **Online registration must be completed online before 10:00 am Friday, June 26th**

Facility gates open at 7:30

Show office will open at 8:00, a blank check needs to be submitted to receive show packets.

Schooling from 8:00 to 8:30 (no jumping) and jumping schooling during a 30-minute break following under saddle classes.

Lead line at 8:45, show starts at 9:00.

Entry Fees: \$12 per class, not to exceed \$30 per division, per rider.

Each participant must submit an equine certificate of health form from our on-site veterinarian along with a blank check to receive your show packet.

An on-site veterinarian will provide this inspection at no cost to the participants, please wait by your trailer after arriving for the vet.

English participants are encouraged to wear horse show attire, shirts with a collar.

Western participants are encouraged to wear western attire.

Ribbons and Prizes will be offered as follows: **Ribbons may be picked up when checks are closed out at the show office.**

Flat Classes: First through 6th place ribbons

Jumping classes: First through 6th place ribbons

1st=6 points, 2nd=5 points, 3rd=4 points, 4th=3 points, 5th=2 points, 6th=1 point

Divisions: Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons + entry fee gift certificates will be awarded

In the event of a tie the rider who scored the highest total points in the following will determine placing:

English – Over fences classes

Western – Horsemanship

Show High Point: Champion and Reserve Champ. ribbons will be awarded and arrangements made to mail or deliver the following week.
